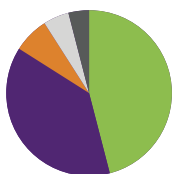
**OVERVIEW**

Primavera Online High School is a tuition-free public charter school that serves 6–12th grade students across the state of Arizona. We provide a high-quality educational program based on best practices that combine academic rigor, flexibility and a strong support network delivering successful student outcomes.

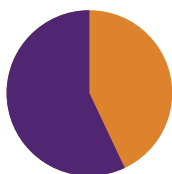
Our mission is to provide a rigorous and personalized education in a highly interactive virtual learning environment. As an alternative school, we are dedicated to educating all Arizona students seeking an accredited high school diploma while engaging students who are credit deficient. Primavera’s student body is culturally diverse with a population that is as follows.

Primavera Online High School was founded by Damian Creamer as Primavera Technical Learning Center in Chandler, AZ, on September 10, 2001. It has since grown to be the largest online high school in the state, providing a second chance to many alternative and at-risk students who otherwise may not have received a high school diploma. Among our alternative students, the statistics are as follows.

**FACULTY & STAFF**

Primavera employs more than 300 faculty and staff. Our teachers are highly qualified in their subject area and are Arizona Certified, with approximately 63% holding a Master’s degree or higher.



**ACCREDITATION**

Primavera Online High School and Middle School undergo an accreditation process every five years through AdvancED, formerly known as the North Central Association Commission on Accreditation and School Improvement. In April 2015, Primavera's accreditation was renewed for an additional five years.



All of our courses are aligned to Common Core and Arizona Career and College Readiness Standards.

**ACADEMICS**

The academic program is organized on a rotating block schedule. Full-time students enroll in two courses every six weeks, allowing them to better focus on courses, catch up or get ahead on credits. Over 78% of our full-time students remain at Primavera year over year until, upon graduation, they earn a fully-accredited high school diploma.

Additionally, alternative or at-risk students who switch to Primavera due to a large credit deficiency have a high graduation success rate.

**STUDENT LIFE**

Primavera offers students numerous ways to get involved. Students can interact with their teachers and peers by attending school events, joining various clubs and by utilizing the communication tools provided in the Parent Student Portal.

Primavera boasts a strong social media presence and invites all students to join the discussion on Facebook, Instagram and Twitter. We also host prom and graduation ceremonies for our students each year.

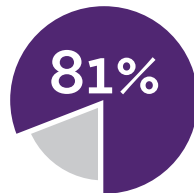
